Marion Female College.

Resolutions Adopted By Trustees November 25th, 1910.

To Board of Trustees Marion Female College:

Your Committee to which you submitted the Resolutions of the Southwest Virginia Synod, passed at a called meeting held at Salem on Nov. 15, 16 and 17, 1910, would respectfully report:

1st. That it is the view of this Committee, that under the Charter of Marion Female College and the trust imposed on the Board of Trustees of said College, for its management and control, the Board cannot legally or morally transfer its duties or assign its trust to another body.

2nd. That in view of the fact that Marion Female College was located at Marion thirty-seven years ago, by reason of a pledge of the people of Marion, that a fund of at least \$5,500 would be raised to begin said institution, and the fact that this fund and other donations and subscriptions were made the citizens of Marion and of Smyth and surrounding counties for the support, maintenance and enlargement of said College, with the tacit understanding that the money would be held as a sacred trust for the purpose for which it was contributed, and in view of the fact that the citizens of this same community have recently expressed their appreciation and interest in continuing the College at Marion by subscribing an additional amount of \$15,000 for the enlargement and betterment of the College a Marion, we are of opinion that this Board would violate the trust and confidence confided in it should it by its actions surrender its control of the College and its property to another body, which would transfer the proceeds of the property to another and distant community, in which the donors of said property have small interest, and which action was never contemplated by this Board, or by those who have heretofore supported and maintained the College.

3rd. That we are of the opinion that it is to the best interest of the School to continue and enlarge its work at Marion or in its vicinity.

4th. That we recommend the following resolutions:

Resolved, 1st. That it is the view of this Board that it cannot under the Charter and the trust imposed in it as the custodians of the property and interests of Marion Female College, comply with the request contained in the resolutions of the Southwest Virginia Synod, held in special session at Salem on Nov. 15, 16 and 17, 1910, the effect of which is to abolish the present Board and turn the property over to another and different body.

Resolved, 2nd. That we regret that we cannot comply with the request of the Synod, and that we decline to do so with the greater respect and with reluctance—believing that we have been confided with a trust which we cannot surrender.

Resolved, 3rd. That we most respectfully request that Synod to reconsider its action and that it lend its aid and co-operation to this Board in maintaining and enlarging the College at Marion.

The above resolutions were adopted by the Board of Trustees by a vote of thirteen to two. It is now conceded, and so announced in the public press, that Marion College will not be removed to Salem.

Bristol School Troubles.

Friends of Superintendent McChesney Lobs Their Points.

Bristol, Va., Dec. 12—C. H. Cooper, J. D. Huddle and Geo. W. Coker, at a meeting of the City Council last week, were re-elected members of the City School Board. Much interest was manifested in this election for the reason that it was understood that the friends of Prof. S. Rhea McChesney, Superintendent of the City Schools, hoped to control election in his behalf. When the same men were nominated and it was proposed to vote for them all together a separate vote was proposed. It was finally decided to go into a caucus to determine who should be elected. The caucus nominated the old members of the board for re-election, and this is taken to mean that the friends of Superintendent McChesney lost their points.

Last summer the School Board elected Chas. E. Anderson, of Smyth county, Va., to succeed Mr. McChesney as supervising principal of the school at a salary of \$1,400. This was the position which Mr. McChesney had held in connection with his position as Superintendent of the Schools, McChesney declined to endorse Mr. Anderson for the place, taking the view that the patrons desired that he should continue in that position. His feelings soon sprang up between members of the Board and Mr. McChesney. The latter appealed to the State Board of Education, with the result that that body took the view that it was not legal to elect a Supervising Principal. This did away with the idea of Mr. Anderson serving in the position, but the Board still would not recognize McChesney for the place. As a result, Mr. McChesney is still having to content himself with the meager salary of \$200 per annum, the amount allowed him by the State Board. He has monthly presented his bill for the monthly pro rata proportion of \$1,400 per annum, but the Board will not allow it, and so the matter stands. It now looks as though Mr. McChesney will get no relief from the Local Board. Members of the Board say they will carry the case to the Supreme Court of the State before they will vote to allow McChesney a single penny out of the City's School Funds.

Notice of Election.

VIRGINIA: At a Circuit Court continued and held for Smyth Co., at the Courthouse thereof, on Monday 21st day of November, 1910:

This day came the Board of Supervisors of Smyth County, by its attorneys and presented a petition signed by all the members of the said Board, praying the Court to enter an order requiring the Judges of Election of the County of Smyth, to open a poll on December, 22nd, 1910 to take the sense of the qualified voters of the said County, on the question whether the Board of Supervisors of said County, on the question whether the Board of Supervisors of said County shall issue bonds of Smyth County, to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, payable on the first days of January and July of each year, one-fourth of said bonds to run for five years, one-fourth for ten years, one-fourth for fifteen years and one-fourth for twenty years, for the purpose of Macadamizing and otherwise permanently improving certain public roads in the Rich Valley Magisterial in said Smyth County, to-wit:


1. To macadamizing the road beginning at the mouth of Cove Creek on what is known as the river-road and running down said river road to the line of the Corporation of the Saltville, near McCreech's Gap, a distance of about eight miles, said Mo-Adam to be nine feet wide with turnouts fourteen feet wide at intervals of about each one half mile, said turnouts not to exceed one hundred feet in length.
2. To permanently improve the following road: (A) The road running from the mouth of Muddy Branch up Beaver Creek to the Valley Road, a distance of about three miles, width, twelve to fourteen feet. (b) The road leading from Old Broad Ford along the Scott road road via United Church to Cedar Branch, a distance of about five miles; width, twelve to fourteen feet. (c) The road leading from the residence of T. G. Sanders along the Walker road to the Rich Valley near the residence of H. L. Morgan, a distance of about two miles; width, twelve to fourteen feet. (d) The Rich Valley road running up Rich Valley from the line of the corporation of the Town of Saltville on the East of said Corporation to the Bland county line, a distance of about twenty miles; width from twelve to fourteen feet. (e) The road leading from the mouth of Cove Creek, eastwardly to Chatham Hill, a distance of about seven miles; width from twelve to fourteen feet. (f) The road leading from Olympia to the Walker's Mountain at Whitehead Gap, a distance of about 3 1-2 miles, width from twelve to fourteen feet.

It is therefore considered by the Court that the Judges of the Election of the County of Smyth, shall on December 22, 1910, open a poll at the various voting places in the County of Smyth, and take the sense of the qualified voters of the said County on the question whether the Board of Supervisors for said County shall issue the bonds for Macadamizing and otherwise improving the said Rich Valley Magisterial District, in said County of Smyth, not to exceed in amount the sum of fifty thousand dollars, and it is further ordered that the regular election officers of said County, at the time hereinbefore designated shall conduct such election and close the polls in such manner as is provided by law in other elections, and made return thereof, as provided by statute in such cases made and provided. And it is further ordered that the Electoral Board of Smyth County shall have printed and furnish the ballots for said election as required by Section 2 of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved February 25, 1908, as amended by an Act approved February 16, 1910. And in the event the question of issuing the said bonds for the said Rich Valley District shall be decided in favor of the issuing of said bonds, and said bonds are issued by the said Board of Supervisors, it is further ordered that the bonds so issued shall have written or printed on said bonds the following sentences: "These bonds are issued for Rich Valley Magisterial District, but the full faith and credit of the entire County is hereby pledged for their payment; and a tax to be levied upon the property of said district to pay them upon maturity" and said bonds shall be in all other respects as required by an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved February 25th, 1908, as amended by an Act of the said General Assembly approved Feb. 16, 1910.

And it is further ordered that certified copy of this order shall be published for four weeks in the newspapers published in Smyth County, and posted by the Sheriff at the front door of the Courthouse for Smyth County, and at each voting place in said County, at least 20 days prior to the election.




