Dearest Mother and Father

We are in the east now. We left Prague at 1,50 having had a terrible time with my Polish visa which I did not have sense enough to get before leaving the U.S.A.

We V than the big coal and iron section which was Germany. A reporter who spoke five languages was in our compartment. I am getting very sensitive to the way people say "[illegible] English, only English." It is unheard of to speak only 1 language over here. I can understand French and German but can am not much on this reporter. The reporter told us how everyone over here hates Americans and thinks we came only for money.

We were interrupted again in the night by a man who said he would bring a "little maiden" into our [illegible]. She turned out to be a [illegible] [illegible]. At Warsaw they didnt even speak German. There is some trouble between their government so we cant get [illegible] tickets. The reporter got us through customs without inspection. Lois bought a [illegible] [illegible] ticket and we have had to ride 3<sup>rd</sup> all day. If we had taken 3<sup>rd</sup> we would have [illegible] \$4.

I tried to buy an orange for Lois who was sick and it was over \$,50 all because of the rediculous tariffs and many of them are started by the U.S.A. In Estonia they tried to get the tariffs off because the children need oranges but were unable to do it until a [illegible] conference of southern people was [illegible] and they feared they would stay away f they did not have their fruit.

[illegible] Poles just got off. One had been away in America 4 yrs. His mother was coming to the station and he was afraid they would not know each other. He would have come back sooner but everyone thought he was a millionaire and would want him to heal the town. The other had been in America 15 yrs and his family were all dead. He was coming back to get work and said he feared he should not have left America.

There are lots of Russians on the train. The men kiss each other 3 times. Once on each cheek and once on the mouth. One would think they would [illegible] their gorgeous mustaches and beards. If gillette razors ever get into Russia there will be another Revolution. We have not had any water all day and are longing for mineral or tea to be put on.
