Wed July 25

We reached Zimbali about midnight last night. They whisked us off and into customs. Lois generally flaunts her German but at customs its a big help to say "[illegible] English" and act innocent. They did not do more than barely glance at things. Lois got tea and I mineral water and we piled on the funniest train I ever saw. They raise the seats to make upper [illegible] but have no sheets or pillows. I told Lois I bet we turned up our watch but we did not and a [illegible][illegible] woke us yelling Kija. The secretary had [illegible] a lively Russian girl to meet us. She thought we did not come so rushed to the Berlin train. Finally we made connection and had a grand bath which is rare. Everyone goes to public baths.

We [illegible] sometime in Vilna. The [illegible] gave it to Lithuania but Poland just ignored it and marched an army in and took it. Paderewski has resigned in despair and [illegible] to his estate in California leaving Poland in the hands of Marshall Pilsudski and awful old devil.

The people are noticeable Eastern. In Prague I asked Mr. Lowri why no woman as waitresses. He said "thats mans work its too easy for woman they are porters etc." It was true that they carry the heaviest baggage in the stations. In Poland we say them crushing rock and building roads. Even so when the Americanized Pole [illegible] that we wouldnt stand for that in America we had to agree that in the open air and not being hurried it might not be worse than eleven hours in a factory keeping up with a big marching.

We are just next the Soviet Consulate here. The soviets are very friendly to the Baptists and other "sects" because ther got to know so many of them in prison when they were together persecuted by the Czar.

These two little countries, Estonia and Latvia, are just allowed to be countries because Europe needs them as barriers against Bolshevism. They have been countries for 10 yrs and any one with any political sense can see that its only a matter of time till they will have to join Russia. I dont dare say that as they are very nationalistic and proud of their country.

We were to have the conference in an old castle but something has gone wrong so we will be in an or [illegible] hotel.

The girl who met us is to be my interpreter. I fear I shall not be very lucid when forced to organize my thoughts in such a way as to mean anything when translated.

The Lutherans here nearly die when told that Lutherans are a "sect" in America.

They have tiny Russian horses and few farm implements. As in Switzerland, C-Slovakia and much of Europe the farm home is built onto the barn. I hope for a lot of mail when I reach [illegible] in the morning.

They have the most gorgeous porcelain stoves here just like the farm stone they reach the ceilings of the rooms
