We are about to cross the border between Austria and Switzerland

things up between you and her. I think the general tone of my letter was such that she will write me if she needs me - of course I realize that for selfish reasons she may wish to handle it all herself

I can understand what hoismaid did with the mail - I have been scene after scene - the letter reached Revue June 28th - if she had sent them at once I would have had ample time - I

suppose the price lists etc are there. It will be fun to see if I can sell any - hois feels that I should not leave her midway in Europe and midway in her vacation - but explained that I never promised I would stay with her the whole time -

I was so relieved to get the mail from everybody that I made up my mind I would never worry again -

yesterday we did not do much but
got off at 7. It takes hours in line to
buy ticket change money etc - I
just bought mine to Geneva -
shopping was very disappointing in
Vienna - they have no large store
where one may look at things - you
have to go to the little shops and
put yourself at the mercy of the
clerks who are desperate to sell
because Europe is so poor - this leaves
little chance to compare or get bargain
tois says if I want to mess over
a lot of francs I should buy in
the U.S.A. I did buy some
place card holders (silver and
crystal) for Maggie - I thought
if she did not want them they would
make good wedding presents - they
were marked "distinctly Viennese"
but I fear I shall find them
cheaper in the U.S.A. - tois thinks
I can do well in Paris with her -
I am sorry I did not get a
dress for myself in Vienna for
Geneva - my only dress, which
K & I bought has buttons on
all sides until I have nothing left
K & I don't hold it against her though
the dress was a total loss - I
haven't sense enough to
know I have the middle aged
spread I should not blame her
it has not withered to date but
at Geneva I shall see the meeting
people - Dr. Tippy told me he had
