A TRIPLE TRAGEDY.

A Bloody Riot Near Saltville, Saturday Night.

On the North fork river, about one mile from Saltville, is a little saloon, which has been the scene of some pretty hard fighting, but on last Saturday night one of most blood encounters that ever took place in Washington county, occurred at that place.

A young man from Roanoke, named Blackwell, was in the saloon, drinking with some friends, when a man named Crawford, who lived near, entered the room, in an intoxicated state and became involved in a quarrel with Blackwell.

Before any one could interfere or get out of his way, Crawford drew a large knife and cut Blackwell's throat from ear to ear, severing the jugular vein and instantly producing death.

Mr. Mitchell, a justice of the peace, who live near issued a warrant for the arrest of the murderer and in the absence of an officer deputized a man named Hughes to make the arrest.

While the warrant was being written, Crawford continued to act like a madman, and attacked a young man named Galliher, whom he carved up in frightful manner.

When Hughes arrived with the warrant, Chapman resisted arrest and made several lunges at the officer with his bloody weapon, when Hughes finally shot him down.

It is thought that both Chapman and Galliher will die.

No blame is attached to Hughes as he was simply doing his duty as an officer.—Bristol Courier.

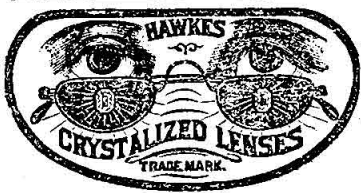
