**PRIMARY FOR
 NINTH DISTRICT.**

**Democrats Will Nominate
 on Saturday, July 19th**

**Executive Committee Met in
 Bristol Saturday-Opinion
 That Rhea Will Have
 no Opposition.**

The Democratic Executive Committee of the Ninth Congressional District of Virginia met at Hotel Hamilton, in Bristol, Saturday at 3 p. m., pursuant to the call of Chairman W. D. Smith.
 The committee is composed of the following members: Chairman W. D. Smith, Hon. B. F. Buchanan, Hon. Peyton St. Clair, Hon. T. A. Lynch and Hon. M. C. Clark. The committee members were either present or represented. Besides the regular committee in attendance were a number of prominent democrats of the district.
 The meeting was called to order by Chairman Smith, and Hon. B. F. Buchanan was elected Secretary.

DATE FOR PRIMARY.
 The only matter before the committee was that of fixing a date for a primary election to nominate a candidate for Congress.

In this connection, the committee unanimously adopted the following resolutions:
 At the meeting of the members of the State Committee composing the Democratic District Committee for the Ninth Congressional District of Virginia, held in the city of Bristol, Va., on the 26th day of April, 1902, pursuant to notice given by the chairman of said committee, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:
 Resolved, That pursuant to provisions for primaries recently adopted by the State Committee, that a primary election shall be held throughout the Ninth Congressional District of Virginia on Saturday, the 19th day of July, 1902, between the candidates of the Democratic and Republican parties of the United States.
 Resolved further, That all persons who desire to become candidates

at said primary will give notice thereof in writing to W. D. Smith, Chairman of the District Committee, on or before the 19th day of May, 1902, the postoffice address of said W. D. Smith being Gate City, Va.
 Unless said written notice is given to said chairman by more than one candidate the primary herein directed will not be held, but the District Committee in the exercise of the power given it by the State Committee will declare the only candidate for the nomination to be the nominee of the Democratic party of said district.
 Democratic papers in the Ninth District will please publish the above notice.

We publish a call of the Executive Committee of this District, for a Primary to be held July 19th, 1902, to nominate a candidate to represent this District in Congress. The Primary will take place provided there should be more than one candidate. Judge Rhea desires to succeed himself. We have heard of no other candidate. It seems to be generally understood that Judge Rhea should be returned, and we hardly think he will have any opposition.

A Tribute to Miss E. Katie Groseloclose.

When I heard of the death of Miss Katie Groseloclose, which occurred near Corinth, Wythe county, Va., at the home of her father, J. L. Groseloclose, on Saturday, the 20th of April, I asked myself "why did God take her and not me or my daughter, her 'sister'?" and the answer came—"The Father in Heaven wanted her at home, and had something for us to do here." Though he called her away in the bloom of life, she did not live in vain.

She was born in Burke's Garden, Va., and consecrated to God in holy baptism in infancy by Rev. J. J. Greener of sainted memory. She entered Marion Female College as a student Sept. 1886, and by her cheerful disposition, and the faithful and conscientious discharge of her duties, gained the love and esteem of her teachers and schoolmates. She continued a student of the College for three years, graduating in the class of 1889. On May the 10th, 1885, she was received into the Marion College Church by the writer, who was pastor, by the solemn rite of confirmation, and remained a faithful and consistent member of the congregation till in 1901, when she was transferred by letter to the Corinth Church she belonged to the College Church she was organist, and I remember with pleasure the promptness with which she discharged the duties of her position, the appropriateness of her selections, and the excellence manifested in their execution.

During the session of 1892, she assisted in the Music Department of Marion Female College.

In order to perfect herself in Music, she spent a session in the Conservatory of Music at Cincinnati, and taught with success in Burke's Garden Academy, Wartburg Seminary at Glendon, Va., and in a Female College at Clifton Forge, Va. There, in the presence of God, she had the privilege and responsibility of influencing the lives of students in various places.

Her position at Clifton Forge, she gave up on account of failing health, and returned to the home of her parents near Corinth. During her long sickness she was always bright and cheerful. Those who visited her felt that to them was given the privilege of seeing one of God's children in the sunshine of His love.

On Sunday morning, the 27th of April, her remains were brought to Marion, and met at the station by a large number of relatives and friends, whence they were conveyed to the cemetery, the teachers and students of the College joining in the procession on the way. The burial services were conducted by Rev. D. S. Fox, her pastor, assisted by the writer, upon whose mind more forcibly than usual was impressed the thought, she is only asleep in Jesus.

Among other evidences of the love and esteem in which she was held were the floral offerings, among which were the two bunches of carnations placed on the grave by the local alumni of the College.

The parents and sisters had the sincere sympathy, of not only the citizens of Marion, where they resided for a number of years, but the Southern Church at large. May the exceeding great promises of Christ and the glorious truths of the Gospel afford them all needed comfort.


