

"Guess at half and multiplying by two" is the way Mr. Cox estimates the Republican campaign fund. The reporter of the Democratic Mass meeting held here last Tuesday goes him one better, he guesses at one third and multiplies by three.

"His (Cox's) nomination would make the Democratic party the leader of the lawless element of the country, and his selection, if such a thing were possible, would turn the White House over to those who defy the government and hold law in contempt. \* \* \* There is no chance of his election if nominated, but why should any Democrat be willing to support a man whose nomination would insult the conscience of the nation?"—William Jennings Bryan, in a statement issued before the San Francisco convention.

New York Tribune: "In the recent Ohio primaries the number participating as Republicans was 280,000, against 125,000 participating as Democrats. An extraordinary Republican majority was thus foreshadowed. Similar news comes from California. The total primary enrollment is 1,250,800. Out of this number 780,000 enrolled as Republicans, against 282,000 enrolled as Democrats. It is not easy to consider California a doubtful State. A campaign of noisy misrepresentation in behalf of Governor Cox is now in full swing. It is especially loud in Eastern newspapers, but there is no sign that the voters are caught by it. Many charges, mostly untrue, are made about the league of peace. But the voters know who beat it, and are not deceived."

New York World, in its usual partisan frenzy, gloats as one might expect of it, over Governor Cox's "proof" of a Republican "slush fund," but the more sober New York Times, though none the less a Democratic journal, indicates a feeling of apprehension as well as shame over the Cox "allegations," saying: "Governor Cox has not done the impossible. No one versed in such matters expected for a moment that he could 'prove' the existence of a \$15,000,000 Republican campaign fund. That was a round figure, convenient for use on the stump. But in the nature of the case there could be no proof, whether mathematical or logical, that such a sum had been or could be raised. Quotas are not collections. Campaign solicitors go out to their work very much in the spirit of General Grant, when a boy, selling a horse for his father. The asking price was much higher than what he was ready to take. We have also to be fair enough to take knowledge of the fact that the amounts gathered by the Republican National Committee are to be apportioned among State and local organizations. This puts a somewhat different color on the large total. Even accepting the figures produced by Governor Cox, the Republican campaign fund is still several millions short of what had been confidently charged."

SWIFT JUDGEMENT

"By this time, the public has had opportunity to judge of the truth of the charges preferred by Governor Cox in respect to the Republican campaign fund. That he has 'proved' his case, as partisan papers are asserting, is ridiculous to the unbiased person who has followed the testimony adduced before the senate subcommittee."—Richmond Evening Journal, Democrat.

OHIO WOMEN ASSAIL COX;  
SAY WHISKEY PARTY LIVES

Chicago, Sept. 8.—Ohio women in Chicago for the two days' conference of Republican State chairmen denied

vigorously the statement of Gov. Cox that there is no longer a whiskey party in their State.  
"If the Governor wants to persuade the men of Ohio that there is no whiskey party in Ohio let him try it," said Mrs. Harriet Taylor Upton, vice-chairman of the national committee "but he can't for a minute pull the wool over the eyes of Ohio women."  
"They remember that very recently the whiskey party in Ohio brought about a referendum against Presidential suffrage in that State, and they will not be fooled by Gov. Cox's statement."

BONDS SHOULD BE AT PAR

"This government should make its liberty and victory bonds worth all its patriotic citizens paid in purchasing them." This is the language of Senator Harding in his speech of acceptance. It means that Senator Harding believes the bonds the men and women and children of America bought in the war period and which have gone below 100 cents on a dollar should be bought back to 100 cents on a dollar.
